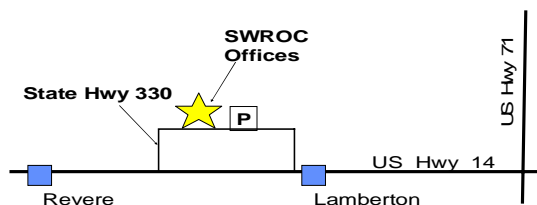

University of Minnesota Featured Speakers

Dr. Judith Eckerle Kang

Dr. Judith Eckerle Kang was adopted from Korea when she was five months old and grew up in Minneapolis, MN. She has since returned to Korea to participate in multiple adoptee groups, tours and language programs. She finished Medical



School at the Medical College of Wisconsin. Dr. Kang completed a post-doctoral research fellowship through the Center for Neurobehavioral Development, funded by a National Institutes of Health training grant. She joined the staff of the International Adoption Medicine Program at the University of Minnesota, having completed her residency in Pediatrics at New York Presbyterian Hospital, Weill Cornell Medical Center, in New York City, NY.

Her research interest is in determining the early factors that can predict cognitive and psychological outcomes in international adoptees. In addition to her research, Dr. Kang performs pre-adoption medical reviews, educates residents and assists in both patient education and patient care in the International Adoption Clinic at the Pediatric Specialty Clinic, Minneapolis.

Dr. Christopher Boys

Dr. Christopher Boys is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Pediatrics. He is a Pediatric Neuropsychologist who completed his PhD in Educational Psychology at the U of MN. He also completed his clinical internship and post-doctoral fellowship in Pediatric Neuropsychology at the U of MN Medical School.



His current clinical interests include: neuropsychological assessment of learning disorders and neurodevelopmental disorders, psychological aspects of & adjustment to chronic medical illness such as cystic fibrosis & diabetes; developing adherence & self-care in children/adolescents with chronic illness, consultation within health care settings; behavioral & developmental disorders including language impairments, dyslexia, ADHD; & fetal alcohol spectrum disorder. Research interests include: neurodevelopmental outcome of high risk/premature neonates; investigating the neuropsychological profile of phenylketonuria; investigating neurocognitive and executive functions in Muscular Dystrophy and Myotonic Dystrophy; & developing a novel model of coordinated school healthcare for medically fragile & chronically ill children. He is currently involved with a number of clinics at the University including the Fetal Substance Exposure Diagnostic Clinic - KDWB Pediatric Family Center, McNamara Alumni Center.
